

Solidarity against snooping practices by the state!

AGAINST §129A AND COERCIVE DETENTION!

SOLIDARITY WITH ANTI-RACIST AND ANTI-FASCIST CAMPAIGNS!

OVER 20 YEARS AGO – 1995, at a time characterized by racist agitation and severe tightening of the legislation on asylum (similar to today but also very different), some people tried in solidarity with refugees to destroy the detention center under construction in Grünau. That attempt failed at the early stages and three people had to go into hiding. Despite taking apart and fincombing the whole social and political network, raiding shared houses and work places, issuing summons and coercive detention orders the investigative authorities got no results. All three had disappeared, the network stayed silent.

JULI 2014: one of the three wanted people, Bernhard Heidbreder, is arrested in Venezuela and since detained in jail in Caracas. A request for extradition to Germany was denied by Venezuela in October 2015, under Venezuelan law the case would have long been outside the statute of limitations. Yet for spurious and unjustified reasons Bernhard remains imprisoned. We demand freedom for Bernhard Heidbreder and his safe status of residency in Venezuela!

JANUAR 2016: a further person who had been part of the former social network receives a summons from the Public Prosecutor General of the Federal Court of Justice in Berlin regarding the preliminary proceedings against the three wanted under § 129a. More than 20 years later this is a renewed attempt to force people from the periphery of the then social circle to give evidence and co-operate with the public authorities. A summons to the public prosecutor's office means the threat of penalty payments and coercive detention. Someone faced with this type of repression needs our solidarity.
